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RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR ACCREDITATION OF FABRICATOR **INSPECTION PROGRAMS**

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1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 **Scope:** The purpose of these rules is to establish procedures governing accreditation of the Fabricator Inspection Program by International Accreditation Service, Inc. (IAS).

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IAS accreditation does not make any representation nor should it be construed as making representation regarding attributes not specifically addressed by the accreditation. Accreditation also does not constitute an endorsement or recommendation for use of a particular fabricator.

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2.0 INITIAL ACCREDITATION

2.1 Initial Application, Fees and Assessment Costs

- Each initial application must be submitted through the IAS Customer portal.
- 26 2.1.2 The new applicant must submit appropriate basic fee and assessment cost as identified in your quotation.
 - Initial applications held for more than 180 days, without the applicant's having 2.1.3 fulfilled IAS requirements for accreditation, are subject to cancellation unless such term is extended by the IAS president or his/her designee.

31	2.1.4	All IAS fees are nonrefundable.
32	2.1.5	Taxes and charges: All sales, use, excise, value-added and similar taxes and
33		charges are the responsibility of the applicant, and the applicant agrees to
34		reimburse IAS for any such taxes and charges imposed on IAS with respect to
35		services provided by IAS.
36	2.1.6	Required documentation as noted in Section 4 of IAS AC157, AC172 or AC196
37		must be submitted.
38	2.1.7	IAS may at any time, in addition to the required documentation noted above,
39		require other information.
40	2.1.8	Initial applicants will be invoiced for the balance of costs and expenses
41		resulting from the onsite assessment.
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43	2.2 Initial	Assessment
14	2.2.1	Upon receipt by IAS of the application, applicable fees, required documentation
45		and the desired scope of accreditation, IAS will process the application as
46		follows:
1 7	2.2.	1.1 A review of submitted documentation will be conducted to determine
48		preliminary compliance with applicable requirements. A letter summarizing
19		preliminary observations will be relayed to the applicant, including a request
50		for any additional data which may be required prior to scheduling the initial
51		assessment.
52	2.2.	1.2 Each fabricator shall obtain the services of an IAS-accredited inspection
53		agency, whose scope of accreditation includes the specified fabrication
54		discipline. The inspection agency shall conduct at a minimum, biannual
55		unannounced inspections (two per year) of the fabrication facility.
56		Unannounced inspections shall commence approximately six months after
57		the fabricator's date of accreditation. Subsequent unannounced inspections
58		shall be conducted at approximate six-month intervals+/- 30 days.
59	2.2.	1.3 Initial Assessment: In consultation with the applicant and the accredited
50		inspection agency, an initial onsite joint assessment will be scheduled to
51		verify compliance with the accreditation requirements.
52	2.2.	1.4 Response to Assessment Report: A written response to any Corrective
53		Action Requests (CARs) and Concerns identified during the initial

64	asses	sment shall be submitted to IAS within thirty (30) days of the conclusion
65	of the	assessment as follows:
66	2.2.1.4.1	Corrective Action Requests (CARs) require a mandatory response on
67		actions taken by the fabricator to resolve the CARs, including
68		objective evidence substantiating the actions taken. The response
69		must include root cause analysis to support CAR closures where
70		appropriate. Resolution of CARs requiring revisions to the fabricator's
71		management and technical system must be documented and
72		submitted to IAS. Objective evidence may be in the form of revisions
73		to procedures, additional training, mentoring and monitoring given to
74		personnel accompanied by appropriate records, and/or other data.
75	2.2.1.4.2	Concerns require a mandatory written response from the fabricator
76		within 30 days of submission of the assessment report. While
77		objective evidence addressing Concerns is not mandatory, the
78		fabricator must inform IAS on the action taken or intended action to be
79		undertaken with a timeline for completion. The action taken by the
80		organization to implement actions to resolve concerns will be verified
81		at the agency's next scheduled assessment or during a follow-up
82		assessment.
83	2.2.1.4.3	If more than 30 days are needed to resolve CARs or Concerns, the
84		fabricator must request, in writing, for an extension from IAS.
85		Requests for an extension should be accompanied by a reasonable
86		estimate on when the responses will be submitted for review.
87	2.2.1.4.4	IAS reserves the right to conduct a follow-up assessment to determine
88		if CARs and Concerns have been satisfactorily resolved.
89	2.2.1.4.5	Failure to resolve all CARS and Concerns within six months from the
90		date of assessment will result in a reassessment or further action
91		against the accreditation as called for in these rules.
92	2.2.2 IAS will	grant accreditation upon determination that based on the onsite
93	assessn	nent and review of evidence submitted, the applicant has met all the
94	accredit	ation requirements as a fabricator inspection program noted in the
95	scope o	f accreditation certificate and available on the IAS website.

96	2.2.3	IAS may decide not to grant accreditation to the applicant for not fulfilling
97		accreditation requirements. Any applicant denied accreditation may appeal this
98		decision as per requirements noted under Section 6.2 of these rules.
99	2.2.4	Each initial accreditation is valid for a one-year period from the accreditation
100		date.
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102	3.0 MAINTENA	NCE OF ACCREDITATION
103	3.1 Renew	al Application, Fees and Assessment Costs
104	3.1.1	Each renewal application must be submitted through the IAS Customer portal.
105	3.1.2	An application to renew accreditation must be filed at least 15 days prior to the
106		expiration date if continued accreditation is desired and shall be accompanied
107		by the applicable fee as identified in the renewal notice.
108	3.1.3	Accreditation is subject to cancellation if an application to renew accreditation
109		is not completed by the renewal date.
110	3.1.4	Taxes and charges: All sales, use, excise, value-added and similar taxes and
111		charges are the responsibility of the applicant, and the applicant agrees to
112		reimburse IAS for any such taxes and charges imposed on IAS with respect to
113		services provided by IAS.
114	3.1.5	All expenses, including but not limited to travel and staff time, related to the
115		assessments are reimbursable to IAS by the fabricator.
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117	3.2 Survei	llance Assessment after Initial Year of Accreditation (for Concrete and
118	Wood	Wall Panel Fabricators only)
119	3.2.1	All accredited concrete and wood fabricators are subject to an onsite
120		surveillance assessment at the end of the initial year of accreditation.
121	3.2.2	Onsite Surveillance Assessment
122	3.2.2	2.1 If IAS determines an onsite surveillance assessment is required, IAS staff will
123		contact the fabricator to schedule the assessment.
124	3.2.2	2.2 At minimum, the following information shall be reviewed during the onsite
125		surveillance assessment: the fabricator's internal audit and management
126		review reports/minutes; any complaints; actions resulting from any Concerns
127		noted in the previous assessment report; any major changes in key
128		personnel, facilities, equipment or in the fabricator's management system.

129		3.2.2	2.3 Surveillance assessment process is similar to the initial assessment process
130			noted above.
131		3.2.2	2.4 IAS may decide not to grant accreditation to the accredited fabricator for not
132			fulfilling accreditation requirements. Any applicant denied accreditation may
133			appeal this decision as per requirements noted under Section 6 of these
134			rules.
135		3.2.2	2.5 For currently-accredited fabricators, failure to respond to an IAS assessment
136			report within 90 days will result in suspension of accreditation and removal of
137			the fabricators accreditation certificate from the IAS website.
138		3.2.3	IAS will grant accreditation upon determination based on surveillance
139			assessment and completion of renewal application that the accredited
140			fabricator has met the accreditation requirements for the fabricator inspection
141			program noted in the scope of accreditation certificate and available on the IAS
142			website.
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144	3.3	Onsite	Reassessment
145		3.3.1	An onsite reassessment is required for concrete and wood fabricators at the
146			end of every two-year term commencing from the date of initial accreditation.
147		3.3.2	2 An onsite reassessment is required for steel fabricators at the end of the initial
148			year and every year thereafter.
149		3.3.3	In consultation with the accredited fabricator and the accredited inspection
150			agency, a joint onsite assessment will be scheduled to verify compliance with
151			the accreditation requirements.
152		3.3.4	Onsite reassessment process is similar to the initial assessment process noted
153			above.
154		3.3.5	For currently-accredited fabricators, failure to respond to an IAS assessment
155			report within 90 days will result in suspension of accreditation and removal of
156			the fabricator's accreditation certificate from the IAS website.
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158	3.4	Extrao	rdinary Assessments
159		3.4.1	Extraordinary onsite assessments may be conducted, including unannounced
160			assessments, to investigate formal complaints or other changes in a
161			fabricator's status that may affect the ability of the fabricator to fulfill IAS
162			requirements for accreditation.

163		3.4.2	All costs associated with the extraordinary assessment will be the responsibility
164			of the accredited fabricator.
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166	4.0 RE	SPONSI	BILITIES OF FABRICATOR
167	4.1	Chang	es to Fabricator's Accreditation Status: Fabricators accredited under these
168		rules s	hall notify IAS in writing within thirty days concerning the following:
169		4.1.1	Change in fabricator name.
170		4.1.2	Change in fabricator ownership.
171		4.1.3	Change in fabricator address.
172		4.1.4	Changes in policies or procedures that affect the fabricator's accreditation.
173		4.1.5	Changes in key technical or supervisory personnel.
174		4.1.6	Change in status, including but not limited to cancellation, revocation,
175			suspension or withdrawal of other accreditations maintained by the fabricator.
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177	4.2	Fabric	ators Operating Under Special Jurisdictional/Governmental Regulations
178		4.2.1	Regulatory entities may place specific compliance requirements on fabricators
179			operating within their jurisdiction. If a fabricator intends to seek acceptance of
180			its reports of its inspections by these entities, they must agree to comply with
181			the additional assessment requirements, including more frequent onsite
182			assessments, as applicable.
183		4.2.2	By executing the IAS application for fabricator inspection program
184			accreditation, the fabricator agrees to furnish all needed documentation, pay
185			the required fees, perform additional witness inspections, or otherwise fully
186			comply with the requirements of the regulatory entities.
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188	4.3	Indem	nification: All applications for an IAS accreditation contain indemnification
189		provision	ons.
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191	4.4	Unann	ounced Assessments: The fabricator agrees to permit unannounced
192		assess	ments of its office and facilities by the IAS for cause, such as formal complaints,
193		pattern	of nonconformance, regulatory requests, etc.
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195	4.5	Usage	of the IAS Name or Symbol by Accredited Fabricators

196	4.5.1 An accredited fabricator can make reference to its IAS accreditation in on its
197	website, in its general literature and promotional materials, and in business
198	solicitations, under the following provisions:
199	4.5.1.1 The fabricator may not reference its accredited status in any way that
200	indicates or implies accreditation in areas outside the actual scope of the
201	specific IAS accreditation; or that indicates or implies IAS recognition of its
202	fabricated products, or the design or performance characteristics of its
203	fabricated products.
204	4.5.1.2 When the IAS name and/or the registered symbol are used, it shall be
205	accompanied by the word "ACCREDITED." The symbol must also include the
206	name of the accredited program, e.g., "Fabrication Inspection Agency."
207	4.5.1.3 When the IAS name or the registered symbol is printed on letterhead and/or
208	other stationery, such stationery may not be used for work proposals or
209	quotations if none of the work is within the fabricator's current scope of
210	accreditation with IAS.
211	4.5.1.4 The IAS registered symbol may not be changed in any way, although it may
212	be enlarged or reduced.
213	4.5.1.5 The IAS registered symbol is to be used on IAS-endorsed reports. The IAS
214	registered symbol displayed on these reports must include the name of the
215	accredited program, e.g., "Fabrication Inspection Agency," provided the
216	reports relate to the fabricator's IAS-approved scope of accreditation.
217	Whenever the IAS symbol is used on a report covering multiple areas, some
218	of which are within the fabricator's scope of accreditation and some of which
219	are outside the scope, the fabricator must clearly identify whatever portion of
220	the report is not covered by IAS accreditation.
221	4.5.2 It is the fabricator's responsibility to not misrepresent its accreditation status in
222	any way, and to secure IAS approval in advance whenever there is a question
223	about the fabricator's intended use of the IAS name and/or symbol.
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225	4.6 Enumerated Conditions
226	4.6.1 As a condition of IAS accreditation, the applicant agrees to inform IAS, in
227	advance, of any intended modification to its accredited inspection process or
228	management system.

229 4.6.2 As a condition of IAS accreditation, the applicant agrees to keep a record of all 230 significant complaints made known to the applicant about the assemblies 231 fabricated under the accreditation, and to make these records available to IAS 232 upon request. The applicant will take appropriate action with respect to such 233 complaints, and document the actions taken. 234 235 5.0 RESPONSIBILITY OF INTERNATIONAL ACCREDITATION SERVICE 236 5.1 **Accreditation Documents:** A certificate of accreditation and scope of accreditation 237 document shall be issued and maintained current for each accredited fabricator upon 238 satisfactory completion of the accreditation requirements. For each accredited 239 fabricator, the scope of accreditation shall be posted on the IAS website. Accreditation 240 actions will also be noted on the IAS website. 241 242 5.2 **Fee Modifications:** Any modifications to the fees must be reviewed and approved by 243 the IAS president or his/her designee. 244 245 5.3 **Proprietary Data:** Data in any accreditation file or application are considered 246 proprietary to the applicant. The data may be disclosed by IAS only upon the written 247 consent of the applicant or pursuant to subpoen a issued by a court or other 248 governmental agency of competent jurisdiction. Proprietary data may also be disclosed 249 to a staff member of IAS or an authorized representative of IAS having a legitimate 250 interest therein; any duly identified representative of any fabricator, or like person or 251 organization who initially prepared the data, or a duly authorized representative thereof 252 stated to be an employee or principal thereof having a legitimate interest therein. 253 Governmental regulatory bodies may be granted access in the interest of public safety 254 or preservation of property as it relates to enforcement of laws/regulations upon receipt 255 of an official written request. 256 257 5.4 Access to Proprietary Data: From time to time, IAS records and files are audited by 258 national and international bodies on a random basis to establish conformance with

263	5.5 Select	ion of Assessment Team: IAS will provide an opportunity to the applicant or
264	accred	ited fabricator to appeal against an assessor or assessment team assigned to
265	assess	the fabricator. This appeal must request in writing with the reasons identified.
266	IAS, in	mutual agreement with the fabricator, may arrange to assign a different
267	assess	sor or assessment team for the scheduled assessment.
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269	6.0 DENIAL, R	EVOCATION, MODIFICATION, SUSPENSION OR CANCELLATION OF THE
270	ACCREDIT	ATION, AND APPEALS
271	6.1 Any ac	creditation is subject to denial, revocation, modification, suspension or
272	cancel	lation upon occurrence of any of the following:
273	6.1.1	Repeated failure of the material, method of construction or equipment to
274		conform to the specifications and fabrication facility inspection manual on which
275		the accreditation was based.
276	6.1.2	Repeated failure of the material, method of construction or equipment to
277		perform properly although meeting the specifications upon which the
278		accreditation was originally based.
279	6.1.3	Failure by the fabricator to comply with the current or updated Rules of
280		Procedure.
281	6.1.4	Failure to comply with the current or updated Accreditation Criteria.
282	6.1.5	Failure to comply with any condition to the issuance of the accreditation.
283	6.1.6	Any misstatement, whether intentionally or unintentionally made, in the
284		application or any data or documentation submitted in support thereof.
285	6.1.7	Failure to comply with any provision contained in the application.
286	6.1.8	Failure to comply with any terms of the management system documentation on
287		which the IAS accreditation was based.
288	6.1.9	Any other grounds considered as adequate cause in the judgment of IAS.
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290	6.2 Appea	ıls
291	6.2.1	The denial, revocation, modification, suspension or cancellation of accreditation
292		may only be appealed by the holder of the accreditation.
293	6.2.2	Procedures for appeals of denial, revocation, modification, suspension or
294		cancellation of accreditation shall be in accordance with the Rules of Procedure
295		for Appeals Concerning International Accreditation Service, Inc., Actions. The
296		IAS president or his/her designee, or the Board of Directors, as the case may

297		be, may shorten any of the time periods set forth in the Rules of Procedure for
298		Appeals Concerning International Accreditation Service, Inc., Actions, if such
299		action is deemed necessary, in their discretion, in the interest of public safety
300		and welfare.
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302	6.3 With N	lo Right To Appeal: Notwithstanding anything in these rules to the contrary, any
303	initial a	pplication, or accreditation may be denied, revoked, modified, suspended or
304	cancell	ed by the IAS president or his/her designee for any of the following reasons with
305	no righ	t of appeal:
306	6.3.1	Failure to pay required fees to IAS within thirty days from the date of the
307		mailing by IAS of written demand for payment.
308	6.3.2	Failure to maintain a current quality control program with the inspection agency
309		noted in the accreditation.
310	6.3.3	Failure to perform any test or to furnish any material or data relating to
311		fabricator accreditation required by IAS within the specified time limit, unless
312		extended by the IAS president or his/her designee.
313	6.3.4	Failure to respond and resolve IAS Corrective Action Requests or Concerns
314		resulting from an IAS assessment report in the allotted time, unless extended
315		by the IAS president or his/her designee.
316	6.3.5	Failure to permit or submit to an assessment as set forth in Sections 2 and 3
317		and, if applicable, the special oversight requirements stipulated in Section 4.3
318		of the Rules of Procedure.
319	6.3.6	Failure to furnish information and/or submit to a surveillance assessment as
320		required in Section 3.2.3 of these rules within the specified time limit.
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322	6.4 Result	s Of Denial, Revocation, Modification, Suspension or Cancellation
323	6.4.1	Upon the occurrence of any of the events set forth in Section 6.1 or Section
324		6.3, IAS, by the decision of its president or his/her designee, may choose any
325		of the following actions:
326	6.4.	1.1 Denial of the application.
327	6.4.	1.2 Revocation of the accreditation.
328	6.4.	1.3 Modification of the accreditation, on such terms as determined by the IAS
329		president or his/her designee.

330	6.4.1	1.4 Suspension of the accreditation for such period on such terms as determined
331		by the IAS president or his/her designee.
332	6.4.1	1.5 Cancellation of the accreditation.
333	6.4.2	The decisions of the IAS president or his/her designee with respect to any of
334		the actions set forth in this section may become effective immediately if
335		deemed necessary, in the interest of public safety and welfare, may be stayed
336		pending an appeal pursuant to the Rules of Procedure for Appeals Concerning
337		International Accreditation Service, Inc., Actions, or may be otherwise stayed
338		on such terms and conditions as determined by the president or his/her
339		designee.
340	6.4.3	Upon revocation or cancellation of the accreditation or during any period of
341		suspension, unless this provision is specifically modified by the terms of the
342		suspension, the accredited fabricator shall discontinue all use of the IAS
343		symbol. The fabricator shall also immediately discontinue any references to
344		IAS accreditation on any reports, certificates, or promotional material.
345	6.4.4	IAS shall have the right to immediately notify governmental jurisdictions and
346		any other interested parties of any improper and unauthorized reference to the
347		continuation of the accreditation, when in the sole judgment of IAS, as
348		determined by its president or his/her designee, such notification is necessary
349		in the interest of public safety or welfare.
350	6.4.5	Upon the determination by IAS that cause exists for any of the actions specified
351		in this section, with respect to the accreditation, IAS shall deliver to the
352		fabricator a written statement, signed by the IAS president or his/her designee,
353		setting forth the factual basis for such action. This written statement shall
354		include a specific reference to the cause for the action which is set forth in the
355		Rules of Procedure. •
